# The Great BC Shake Out

Yesterday, schools across the province took part in the Great BC Shake Out earthquake drill. At Richardson, students learned about what could happen during an earthquake and how to keep themselves safe should one ever occur. In addition, our students practiced the "Duck, Cover, Hold" procedure too. This procedure involves ducking under a desk, covering our heads and backs, and holding on to the legs of the desk. Students then counted to 60 and awaited further instructions from their teacher. This was the first of three Earthquake drills that we will complete as part of our Emergency preparedness plan.

## Student Vote

Our intermediate students took part in the BC Student Vote this week, casting their votes for the candidates in Delta North. This was an effective learning opportunity, as student leaders took on the roles of voting clerks, voting officers and scrutineers while classes rotated through and each student voted. Our intermediate teachers spent time in class teaching about government, political parties



and elections so that our students could be informed about how to vote. Don't be surprised if students remind you to vote in our provincial election tomorrow!

## Dressing for the Weather

Although we have enjoyed some wonderful fall weather and many warm sunny days, this week was much more rainy and wet. As the temperature continues to dip, it is important that students come dressed in outerwear appropriate for the cold, wet, and wind. Here on the West Coast, rain is just a fact of life. On most days, students will be going outside at recess and lunchtime. It is only in the case of **extremely poor** weather, that we designate the recess and/or lunch hour as an "in day" which means that students are to stay inside and play quietly in their classrooms rather than venture outdoors. We refrain from doing this unless absolutely necessary, as the children need the opportunity to get out in the fresh air and be

Because our field also gets quite mucky and wet at this time of year, packing an extra set of clothes into your child's backpack, no matter what grade they are in, is also suggested.
